### *Explore the Adriatic stunning coastline.*

## 27 Nights

### Day One – Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> August

The group meet up together in Umag, Croatia. This evening we will enjoy a Welcome Dinner in the campsite restaurant.

### Day Two – Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> August

A full day excursion to the ancient town of Rovinj, with its narrow alleyways and friendly people and then on to Porec, a former Roman seaside resort. Lunch will be provided.

### Day Three – Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> August

Our excursion today will take us on a visit to two attractive medieval hilltop towns, firstly Grožnjan, known as the “artist village”, and later to Motovun, situated in the north of the Istria region, overlooking the Mirna River valley. Lunch is included.

### Day Four – Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> August

Free day to enjoy the campsite and its facilities.

### Day Five – Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> August

An excursion to Pula, a seafront city on the tip of Croatia’s Istrian Peninsula, known for its protected harbour, beach lined coast and Roman ruins.

### Day Six – Monday 25<sup>th</sup> August

We drive to our next campsite in the Plitvice National Park for a two-night stay. On the way, we stop off to visit the Baredine Caves with their display of stalactites & stalagmites **190 miles**

### Day Seven – Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> August

Today we will be taken to the Plitvice Lakes, an area of such outstanding natural beauty that it is on the UNESCO World Heritage list. The 16 lakes are remarkable for their constantly changing colours ranging from azure to green, grey and blue. This evening, we will have a light meal in the campsite’s restaurant



### Day Eight – Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> August

We continue our journey to our next campsite on the coast near the ancient town of Trogir, this will be our home for six nights. This evening we enjoy a campsite restaurant dinner with wine. **150 miles**

### Day Nine – Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> August

A water taxi this morning will take us on a short journey to Trogir, where we will meet our guide for this walking tour. It has a history going back 2,300 years, the town being the oldest on Croatia’s Adriatic coast. Nicknamed “The Stone Beauty” you will find a host of palaces, churches, towers and fortresses all concentrated on a small island.

### Day Ten – Friday 29<sup>th</sup> August

Three Island Tour – spend the day cruising around the rich Trogir archipelago. Lunch included. Please note that this excursion may change to Saturday/Monday depending on the weather forecast.

### **Day Eleven – Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> August**

A free day for you to enjoy the campsite beach and take a swim in the warm waters, or you can take a water taxi and return to discover more about Trogir.

### **Day Twelve – Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> August**

We visit Croatia's second largest city, Split for a guided walking tour. Originally built around the Palace of the Emperor Diocletian, the building finished in AD 305, still forms the inner core of the city and is full of busy shops and markets.

### **Day Thirteen – Monday 1<sup>st</sup> September**

Relax today, enjoy the beach or take a walk around the bay.

### **Day Fourteen – Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September**

Another driving day as we leave Croatia for a while and travel to our campsite near Mostar in Bosnia-Herzegovina for our four-night stay. **135 miles**

### **Day Fifteen – Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September**

We have a guided tour of Mostar, a lovely old city with quaint narrow cobbled streets. Lunch is included in a local restaurant.



### **Day Sixteen – Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> September**

Today we visit the “stone town” of Pocitelj, situated on the left bank of the Neretva River. The town was mentioned in written sources in 1444. Lunch included.

### **Day Seventeen – Friday 5<sup>th</sup> September**

We will walk from the campsite to the village of Blagaj. Built at the source of the River Buna, the water flows out of the 200-metre cliff wall. It is also the site of a 16<sup>th</sup> Century *tekija* (monastery), built for the Dervish cult that is reputed to be one of the most mystical places in Bosnia. This evening, we dine in a local restaurant

### **Day Eighteen – Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> September**

Back into Croatia today as we drive to our campsite for five nights, near the city of Dubrovnik. **90 miles**

### **Day Nineteen – Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> September**

We visit the medieval city of Dubrovnik, where we will have plenty of free time to discover this “Pearl of the Adriatic”. Walk the walls and enjoy its pristine fortifications surrounded by clear blue sea. Lunch is provided in the City.

### **Day Twenty – Monday 8<sup>th</sup> September**

A free day to enjoy the campsite or return by public transport into Dubrovnik – try the Cable Car Ride with its stunning views from the top.

### **Day Twenty-one – Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> September**

An early start for a very full day's excursion to the Peljesac Peninsula to visit Ston, famous for its old salt flats and for having the second longest city walls in the world.

### **Day Twenty-two – Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> September**

A free day is required after yesterday's adventure.



### Day Twenty-three – Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> September

A drive to the historic town of Omis where we will stay for two nights **120 miles**

### Day Twenty-four – Friday 12<sup>th</sup> September

We will take a leisurely boat ride through the Cetina Canyon to a picturesque beauty spot. The Canyon cuts through some heavily wooded landscape rich with wildlife and fish. Traditional lunch is served.

### Day Twenty-five – Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> September

We journey on to our last campsite, the Zaton Holiday Resort north of Zadar, and we stay here for three nights **120 miles**

### Day Twenty-six – Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> September

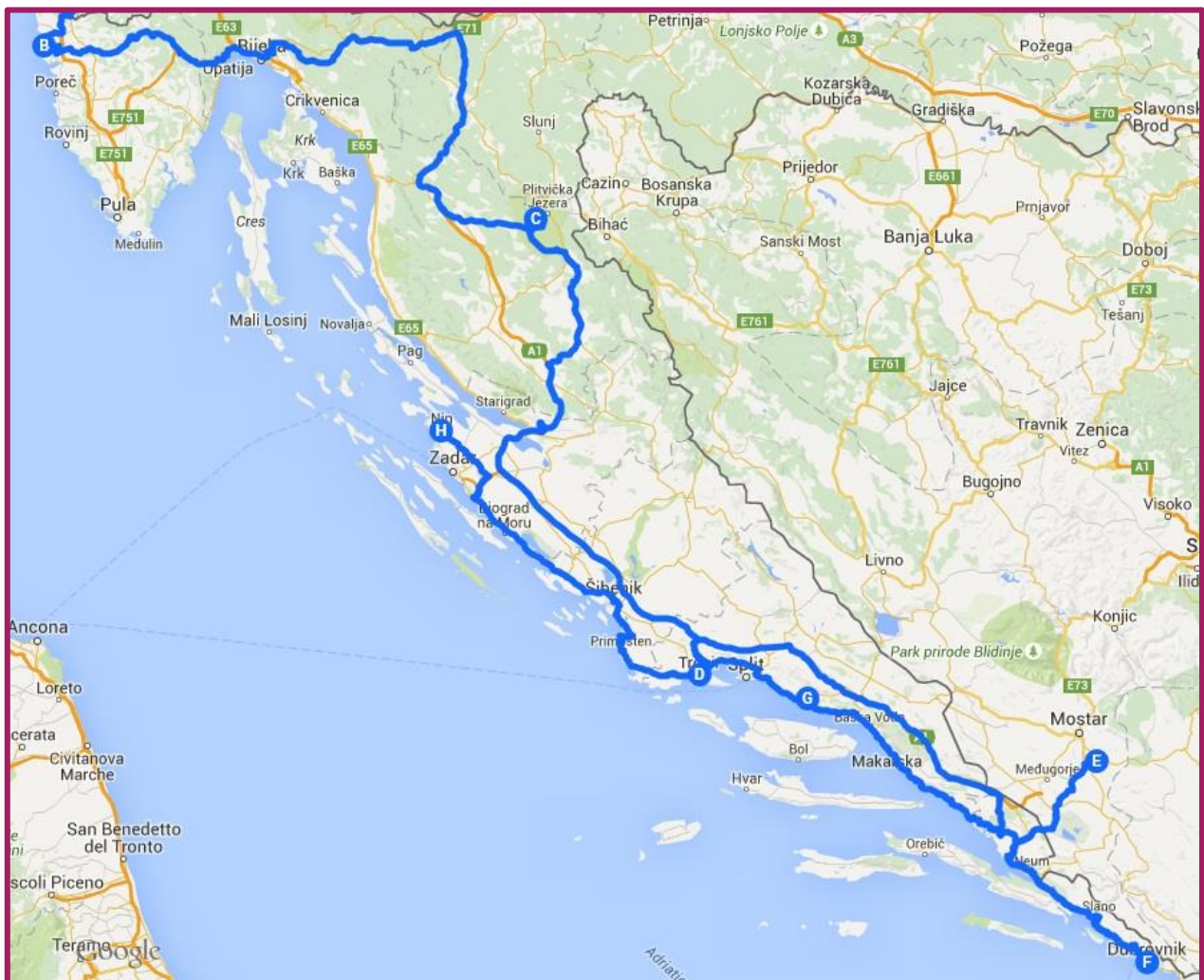
Excursion to Zadar for a walking tour followed by free time.
